	The topics for the seminar papers will be determined by the chair. The kick-off event for this seminar takes place towards the end of the winter semester—in January or Februar.		

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	<p>Presentations will most likely be scheduled in April or May. More details will be announced in due time via this StudIP course. The seminar paper is approx. 4200 words (14 pages) long and may be written in German or English. Presentation and paper both account for 50% of the final grade.</p> <p>The examination office (Prüfungsamt) assigns the spots for writing a seminar paper together with the Bachelor's thesis' assignment.
